
Training doctors to provide children's mental health care in Mongolia

- While one in seven children in Mongolia is thought to experience some form of mental disorders, there are only a few physicians in the country who can provide mental health care for children, and there is no support system in place, including for co-medical staff.
- •This project aims to train doctors who can provide children's mental health care in Mongolia. To this end, we will develop a training curriculum in conjunction with specialist training in Mongolia, and provide training for supervisors so that Mongolian specialists can conduct their training independently.
- •This project will be implemented by the Department of Child psychiatry, School of Medicine and the Psychological Support & Research Center for Human Development, Nagoya University, which are experts in child psychiatry and clinical psychology, in cooperation with the Aichi Psychiatric Rehabilitation Center, and in collaboration with the Mongolian National University of Medical Sciences, the Mongolian National University of Education, and the Mongolian National Psychiatric Hospital.
- As a result of this project, the number of child mental health specialists and specialized medical institutions in Mongolia will increase, and the child mental health care system in Mongolia is expected to be greatly improved.



<Training schedule>

August: Acceptance for training of 10 supervisors

- Training for supervisors
- Understanding of training contents and learning of teaching methods

October: Dispatch of 5 experts

• Basic training in child psychiatry for psychiatrists, pediatricians, psychologists, teachers, etc.

January: Acceptance of 10 trainees

Training in applied child psychiatry: Visits to specialized facilities, participation in case conferences and meetings at related facilities, etc.
