## (Training doctors to provide children's mental health care in Mongolia)

①While one in seven children in Mongolia is thought to experience some form of mental illness, there are only a few physicians in the country who can provide mental health care for children, and there is no support system in place, including for comedical staff.

②The purpose of this project is to establish a training system for doctors who can provide children's mental health care in Mongolia.

③ Develop a training curriculum in conjunction with the 6-month formal training program led by the Mongolian Medical University to train specialists in children's mental health and establish a supervisor training and training system to provide independent and continuous training. In addition, training in the Tanaka-Binay Intelligence Test, which is necessary for developmental support, will be provided. This project will be implemented by the Nagoya University Medical School's Department of Psychosomatic Medicine for Parents and Children and the Research and Practice Center for Supporting Mental Development, both of which are specialized institutions in child psychiatry and clinical psychology, in cooperation with the Aichi Prefectural Psychiatric Rehabilitation Center, and in collaboration with Mongolian Medical University, Mongolian National Psychiatric Hospital, and Mongolian University of Education.

④ By training more than 30 child mental health specialists at the end of the project, the minimum necessary medical treatment system will be established in the country. The establishment of a medical system and the training of supervisors are expected to lead to the establishment of a system to train specialists in the country.
