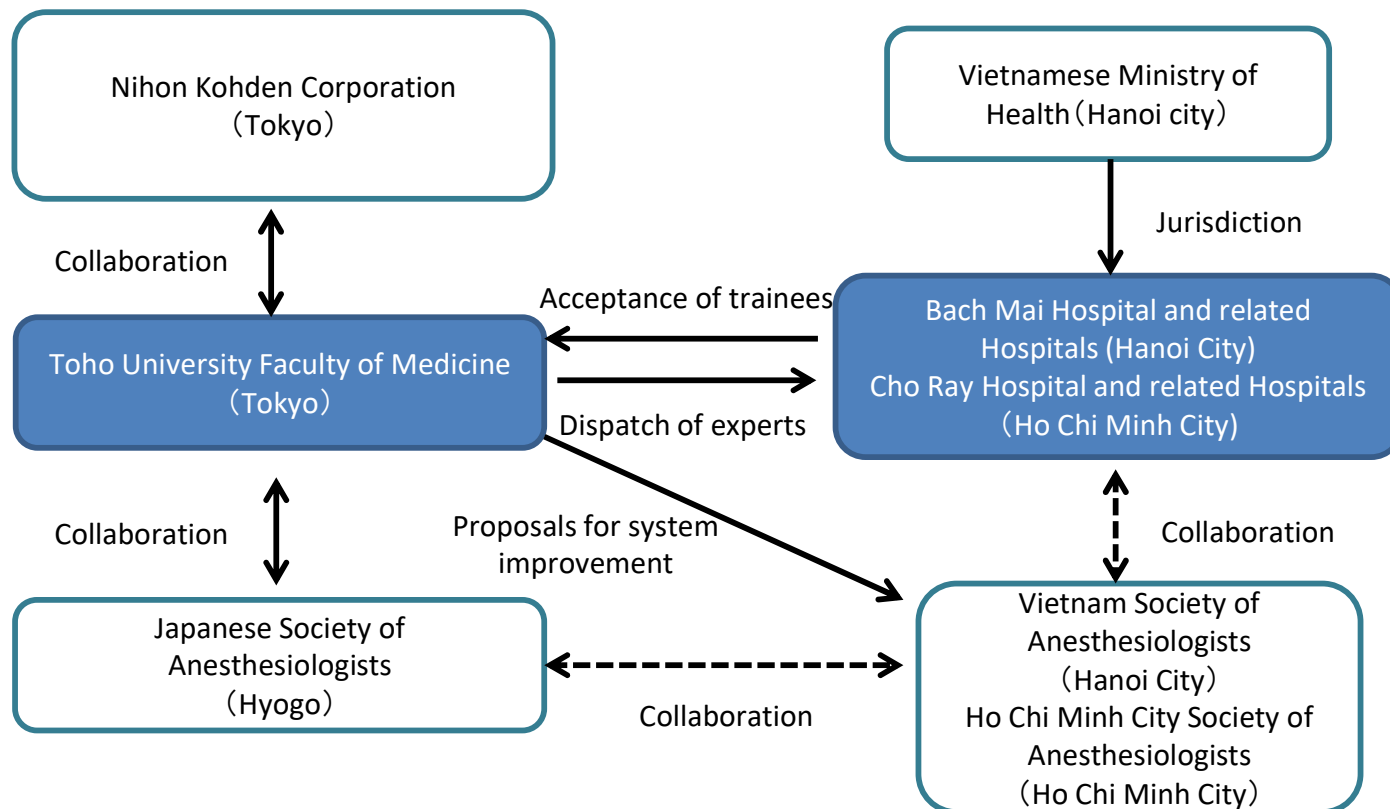


Introduction of perioperative care by using noninvasive technology in Vietnam

- A preliminary survey reveals that the primary challenges facing anesthesiologists in Vietnam are the shortage of human resources and the lack of educational opportunities in perioperative medical care.
- Trainees from Vietnam selected by Vietnam Society of Anesthesiologists and Ho Chi Minh City Society of Anesthesiologists will participate in a program for perioperative management certified by Japanese Society of Anesthesiologists at Toho University.
- Experts from Toho University will hold workshops on perioperative management in Vietnam.
- In cooperation with the Vietnam Society of Anesthesiologists, introduce an anesthesia recording system to collect data of perioperative management efficiently, and try to create a scheme to continuously develop perioperative medical care in Vietnam.
- The objectives of this project are to realize higher quality safe perioperative management by utilizing noninvasive technology and establish relationships between Vietnam and Japan in the field of anesthesiology.
